





## Spring Vale Primary Weekly News – 28<sup>th</sup> June 2021

### Covid Cases

Since our full return on March 8<sup>th</sup>, we have had no positive cases of COVID from adults or children. However, this last fortnight, we have been notified about 3 positive cases in children. We understand there has been some confusion about there being confirmed cases in school but no need for bubble closures. Whenever, we are notified of a positive case, we have to contact Public Health Wolverhampton to complete a risk assessment with them:



In these instances, they have informed us that there is no need to close a bubble because of the time which had passed since the children were last in school. At this point, we have to notify parents of children within the bubble of the positive case and then notify all parents of a positive case in school. Moving forwards, when we notify all parents, we will let you know which year group. We will continue to let all parents know when a year group has a bubble closure (although we pray this does not happen).



**MEET the TEACHER** Change of date: On Friday 16<sup>th</sup> July, children in Reception to Year 5 will be spending some time with their new teachers. In order to comply with risk assessments teachers will move and introduce themselves and teach the class at a social distance in the classrooms the children are currently in. Reception will move to the school hall due to Reception parents' open mornings/afternoons. Children should be taken to their usual classes when dropped off at school in the morning and they will be dismissed from their usual class in the afternoon.
